I WELCOME TO THE EHF FINALS MEN 2024

WHICH TEAM WILL LIFT THE EHF EUROPEAN LEAGUE TROPHY IN HAMBURG?

The first season of the EHF European League Men under the new competition format is reaching its summit – the EHF Finals Men 2024 on 25/26 May at Barclays Arena in Hamburg. A total of 37 teams were on the starting grid last September, then 32 in the group matches, 16 in the main round, and eight in both the play-offs and quarter-finals. Now just four contenders are left as we head into the last four matches of a tantalising season, which will for sure get a fitting finish at the 13,182-capacity arena in Hamburg as all teams are ready to go *all-in* once more.

Germany has been hugely dominant in Europe's second-tier club competition over the past two decades, winning 17 of the 19 trophies since 2004 – a series only interrupted by Hungarian side Pick Szeged, who won the former EHF Cup in 2014, and by Sport Lisboa e Benfica from Portugal, the EHF European League winners in 2022.

No less than three German teams are present in Hamburg, eager to add yet another European club title for their country. Füchse Berlin lifted the trophy a year ago and they are back at the EHF Finals, following a campaign that saw them suffer consecutive losses to Sporting CP in the main round, but the titleholders were back to their best to see off HBC Nantes in the quarter-finals.



In their all-German semi-final on Saturday 25 May at 18:00 CEST, they meet Rhein-Neckar Löwen, the team that played more matches (16) than any of the other EHF Finals contenders, since they started their campaign in the qualification round and later went through the play-off round.

In the first semi-final at 15:00 CEST, SG Flensburg-Handewitt hope to reach a European final again, 10 years after their stunning EHF Champions League triumph. Flensburg are the team with the most goals scored per match (37.3) this season, but they will face fierce resistance from Dinamo Bucuresti, who are back in a European semi-final for the first time in 20 years. The Romanian side boasts the top scorer of the comptition so far: right wing Andrii Akimenko with 83 goals.

Those four teams eye the trophy as the stage is set for another captivating weekend of handball in Hamburg. We wish all media representatives best of luck for their coverage of the EHF Finals 2024. I ALL EYES ON THE TROPHY

SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED AWARD AWAITS THE CHAMPIONS

The EHF Finals Men 2024 takes place at Barclays Arena in Hamburg with three teams from Germany and one from Romania eying the trophy. On Saturday 25 May, SG Flensburg-Handewitt meet Dinamo Bucuresti in the first semi-final, before Rhein-Neckar Löwen take on Füchse Berlin, the winners of the EHF European League Men in 2022/23, for the second ticket to the final on Sunday 26 May.

Like in the past three seasons, the champions will receive a trophy which has been specifically designed for the EHF European League. Developed by the Oiko Design Office agency in Barcelona, the trophy displays a goal as the main objective of the sport, and reflects the dynamic movement of a ball hitting the target. The net formed in the shape of a shield symbolises handball as a team sport.

Accreditations

You can pick up your accreditation at the media entrance of Barclays Arena. The media entrance is located at arena entrance "E4". Please also refer to the map below.


You can pick up your accreditation during the following times:

- Sunday, 26 May 2024: 10:00 18:00 CEST

At the accreditation pick-up, you will be required to present a copy of the confirmation email which you received from the EHF and a valid photo ID (e.g. passport or driving license) in order to collect your accreditation.

IMPORTANT: If, for whatever reason, you are not able to attend the event, you must cancel your accreditation and inform us by email at media@eurohandball.com. Failure to show up at the event could mean that you do not receive accreditation at future EHF events.



Parking & public transport

If you arrive by car, you can use the arena car park "Parking Arena Grey". The parking lot opens at 9:00 CEST on event days; the parking fee for the entire day is €10. See the map below for directions.

With your accreditation you can use public transport in Hamburg (zones A to F) for free:

- Suburban trains (S-Bahn): Take S3 (direction Pinneberg) or S5 (direction Elbgaustraße) and exit
 at "Stellingen Arenen". From about 12:30 CEST onwards a bus shuttle will run regularly from
 the train station to Barclays Arena.
- Metrobus: Take line 22 (S-Blankenese U-Kellinghusenstr.) and exit at "Hellgrundweg/Arenen" or line 180 and (S-Holstenstr. - S-Stellingen - Arenen) exit at "Am Volkspark".

Media centre access

The media centre is located in the "Platinum" area inside Barclays Arena. The entrance for media representatives is via arena entrance E4. The media centre is located close to the media seats and the mixed zone. The press conference room is directly opposite to the media working area.

Workspaces will be available in the media working area. A dedicated media catering will also be available in the media centre.

Catering

Coffee, water, non-alcoholic beverages as well as sweet and savoury snacks will be available in the catering area of the media centre. For lunch and for dinner, a warm meal including vegetarian options will be available. Please note that smoking is not permitted anywhere inside Barclays Arena.

Media tribune

Media seats (with tables, cabled internet, wifi and plugs) will be in sector U16 in the lower tier of Barclays Arena. A certain number of seats will be allocated prior to the event to written media representatives. Media volunteers are available to show you to your seats.

Photographers

Photographers can pick up their photo bibs from the info desk in the media centre. A small deposit (£20 or press card) will be required on arrival to ensure the return of bibs after the event.

Photo positions are located behind the goals. Photographers must wear their accreditation and the bib to be able to access them. Photographers are requested to take their places in the photo positions ahead of the start of each game.

It is mandatory to remain seated during a match and it is forbidden to enter the court of play. Changing sides is only possible at half-time and it is forbidden to cross the court of play to do so. The adequate routing will be presented in the photo briefing.

If deemed necessary, a photo positions plan may be implemented. Photographers cannot book or reserve a position. Priority will be given to the EHF photographers, major agencies, team photographers and national media of the teams playing.

IMPORTANT: The mandatory photo briefing takes place in the media centre on both Saturday and Sunday at 14:00 CEST.



FACTS & FIGURES: IMPORTANT NUMBERS BEFORE THE FHE FINALS MEN 2024

After the captivating quarter-finals, the EHF European League Men is ready for the season-ending EHF Finals Men 2024 at Barclays Arena in Hamburg on 25/26 May.

Here are interesting facts & figures before the last four matches of the season and the crowning of the 2023/24 champions:

- 1 quarter-final match ended in a draw, when Füchse Berlin and HBC Nantes tied 33:33.
- 1 team won both quarter-final legs: Dinamo Bucuresti beat Skjern Håndbold 28:27 and 38:34; Dinamo had also won both legs in the play-offs.
- 1 of four German teams in the knockout phase did not qualify for the EHF Finals: TSV Hannover-Burgdorf lost against IK Sävehof in the play-offs.

1

former EHF Champions League winner is part of the EHF Finals Men 2024: SG Flensburg-Handewitt (2014).

- 1 participant in the EHF Finals 2023 is back at the event this year: defending champions Füchse Berlin; last year's runners-up Fraikin BM. Granollers lost in qualification, Frisch Auf Göppingen didn't play in Europe, and Montpellier HB competed in the Machineseeker EHF Champions League.
- 1 team in the past 10 seasons has managed to win Europe's second-tier competition two years in a row: Göppingen, in 2016 and 2017; Füchse (in 2019) and SC Magdeburg (in 2022) both lost a final as the defending champions.
- 1 team at the EHF Finals started their 2023/24 campaign in the qualification round ahead of the group matches: Rhein-Neckar Löwen.
- **1** of the four EHF Finals participants played in the EHF Champions League last season: Dinamo.

- 2 of the participants in 2024 have not played at the EHF Finals before: Flensburg and Dinamo.
- 2 nations are represented at the EHF Finals: Germany with three teams, and Romania with one; 19 different nations were represented by the 32 teams at the start of the group matches.
- 2 goals was the smallest overall margin in the quarter-finals: Löwen vs Sporting CP 60:58.

quarter-final matches featured 70 goals or more: Skjern vs Dinamo 34:38, and Sävehof vs Löwen 30:41.

- 2 non-German clubs only have won the trophy in Europe's second-tier club competition in the past 20 years: Szeged won the EHF Cup in 2014, and Benfica the EHF European League in 2022.
- 2 quarter-final matches were attended by more than 5,000 spectators – both legs of Füchse vs Nantes: 7,179 fans in Germany; 5,902 in France.
- **3** teams at the EHF Finals 2024 played the EHF FINAL4 in the past: Flensburg, Füchse, Löwen.
- **3** of the eight quarter-final matches were won by the visiting team; one match ended in a draw.

teams at the EHF Finals have won European trophies before, only Dinamo haven't done so yet.

- **3** German teams at the EHF Finals has happened once before: in 2021, when Füchse, Löwen, and Magdeburg took part in the inaugural edition.
- 5 matches in the quarter-finals, and 78 in total this season, featured 60 or more goals.

- **10** goals was the biggest aggregate margin in the quarter-finals: Flensburg vs Sävehof 69:59.
- 20 years ago, Dinamo played their only previous semi-final, in the EHF Cup against BM. Altea.



goals was the most for a team in a quarter-final match, when Flensburg won 41:30 at Sävehof.

- **52** goals was the most by a team this season, when Dinamo beat Izvidac 52:24.
- 55 was the lowest number of goals in a quarterfinal match, when Dinamo beat Skjern 28:27.

- **72** goals at Skjern vs Dinamo (34:38) was the highest number of goals in a quarter-final match.
- 83 goals make Dinamo's Andrii Akimenko the competition's leading goal scorer ahead of the EHF Finals; next is Löwen's Niclas Kirkeløkke with 79 goals since the start of the group matches.
- **506** goals were scored in the quarter-finals, an average of 63.25 per match.
- **10,017** fans in the XXL Arena in Nantes made the group match between Nantes and Löwen the best-attended game in the competition so far.
- **13,182** seats is the capacity of Barclays Arena in Hamburg, the venue for the EHF Finals.

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A MATCH AT THE EHF FINAL MEN 2024 ENDS IN A DRAW

All matches of the EHF Finals Men 2024 shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes

If a semi-final match or the final ends in a draw, there will be a five-minute break followed by one extra time of 2 x 5 minutes; there will be a one-minute break at half-time for the changeover of teams.

perform as goalkeepers.

- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached

If the third-place match ends in a draw, there shall be no extra time; the match will be decided directly by penalty throws.

If penalty throws are needed to decide the match, the procedure is as follows:

- Only players (incl. goalkeepers) who are listed on the match report and are not suspended or disqualified at the end of the playing time are entitled to participate at the penalty throws.
- At the technical meeting the teams will be informed at which goal the penalty throws will be taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.
- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each until a decision (a winner) is reached, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws.

- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the rules of the game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.
- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again, five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).
- In the second round, a decision is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.
- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.
- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.
- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.

- SG Flensburg-Handewitt are the only group winners from the main round that have made it to the EHF Finals.
- In the main round, the German side won all four matches by at least 10 goals.
- They had two one-goal defeats this season: in the group match at Kadetten Schaffhausen, and in the quarter-final at home against IK Sävehof after they had already won the away leg 41:30.
- On average, Flensburg have scored 37.3 goals per match this EHF European League season; they have scored 40 or more goals in five of their 12 matches.
- Flensburg are the only club that has won four different EHF trophies, with a chance to add a fifth this season: EHF Cup in 1997; City Cup in 1999; Cup Winners' Cup in 2001 and 2012; and EHF Champions League in 2014.
- Last season, Flensburg hosted but did not play the EHF Finals following a home defeat against Spanish side Fraikin BM. Granollers in the quarter-finals.

- Dinamo Bucuresti are the only team that won all four knockout matches and all against Danish teams: in the play-offs against Bjerringbro-Silkeborg, and in the quarter-finals against Skjern Håndbold.
- Dinamo have lost four times this season twice against the same two teams: against Füchse Berlin in the group matches, and against Sporting CP in the main round.
- The Romanian side appears in their first European semi-final in 20 years; in 2003/04, they lost to BM. Altea in the semi-final of the EHF Cup; their only final was in the Challenge Cup 2000/01.
- Right wing Andrii Akimenko heads into the EHF Finals as the competition's top scorer with 83 goals.
- Goalkeeper Vladimir Cupara leads the goalkeeper standings with 153 saves.
- Dinamo scored the highest number of goals in an EHF European League match this season, when they beat HC Izvidac 52:24 in the group matches.



- Rhein-Neckar Löwen reached the EHF Finals Men after defeating the team that had beaten Füchse Berlin two times in the main round: Sporting CP.
- Löwen edged out Sporting 60:58 on aggregate in the quarter-finals, with 31 saves in total by goalkeeper David Späth.
- David Späth will face three Füchse players who were his teammates when Germany won the 2023 IHF Junior World Championship: Tim Freihöfer, Matthes Langhoff, and Nils Lichtlein.
- Löwen are the only team at the EHF Finals that played qualification prior to the group matches; they have won 13 of their 16 matches so far this season.
- The German side plays their second EHF Finals, after finishing third at the inaugural event they hosted in 2021; Löwen also played, and won, the first EHF Cup Finals back in 2013.
- Niklas Kirkeløkke (79 goals since the start of the group phase, including 14 in the quarter-finals) is the second-best scorer of the season, trailing Dinamo's Andrii Akimenko by four goals.

- Füchse Berlin beat Rhein-Neckar Löwen when the teams also met in the semi-finals of the EHF Finals Men 2021.
- Füchse triumphed 35:32 but lost the final against SC Magdeburg the next day.
- This season, Füchse were the only team that won all six group matches; they then lost twice to Sporting CP in the main round but still advanced to the EHF Finals following knockout wins over Kadetten Schaffhausen and HBC Nantes.
- Füchse have won 11 of their 14 matches so far this European season.
- The German side aims for their fourth title at Europe's second-tier level, after winning the EHF Cup in 2015 and 2018, and the EHF European League in 2023.
- Fabian Wiede the MVP of the EHF Finals 2023 – has been part of all 10 titles the club won in the last 10 years.
- Füchse's Danish right back Mathias Gidsel has been named IHF World Player of the Year 2023 after he was the top scorer of EHF EURO 2024, and the MVP of the 2023 IHF World Championship.
